A Five-Year Strategic Plan 2019 to 2023

Fondly regarded as Greensboro's living room, Greensboro Free Library proudly serves Greensboro and its surrounding towns. This is something we have been doing, in one form or another, since 1873. We currently provide reading and reference access through a range of books, materials, programs and the internet. Our outstanding paid staff of three, and cadre of dedicated volunteers offer a warm welcome to community members of all ages, abilities and interests. Patrons enjoy comfortable chairs, a fireplace, coffee and tea, and our art gallery. We are an internet destination. Books and materials are found throughout. We take pride in our mystery, fiction, non-fiction, local and Vermont authors collections, large print, DVDs, audio, youth and Children's collections. Upstairs meeting room and our Maker Space offer seating and tables for adult and youth programs and activities. Book discussions and other program offerings cover a wide range of interests. Young adults do homework after school. Children enjoy story hour and activities several mornings each week. Year-round and seasonal youth and adults are drawn to summer reading programs, book discussions and activities. Upstairs, our ongoing book sale is a popular resource and a repository for our patrons' book overflow.

The library is warmly regarded and generously supported by the year round and seasonal community. Six elected Trustees plus three alternates support the overall needs of the library and librarian, including oversight of library operations, building maintenance, and fundraising. Our fundraising activities include a spring and fall newsletter, each with appeal envelope; a midwinter Chili Dinner and youth performance, and summer community-wide raffle. The library also has its own Trustee/treasurer, responsible for payroll, budgeting and maintaining all financial operations. Despite our structural stability, vigilance and creative effort are still needed to continue to meet our increasing budget and justly compensate those who have chosen to join us in this essential civic enterprise.

Therefore, we see both challenges and opportunities as we seek to meet the changing needs of our community, as we are best able, in ways appropriate to our library. With this in mind, we have identified four goals to help guide us as we embark on this plan to serve.

Mission Statement

The Greensboro Free Library's mission is to serve as a community center by providing resources and programs for lifelong learning and access to the world of information.

Goal 1: The Library will be a vibrant community center.

With experienced staff, volunteer assistance and resource sharing, the library serves the community.

The Library continues to enhance program offerings to ensure its relevance to local needs.

The Library shares resources with groups and organizations in the community.

The Library stays current with technological and electronic resources that meet the needs of its patrons and are within the financial capabilities of the library.

Goal 2: The Library will be a responsible steward of its facility.

Goal 3: The Library will pursue adequate funding to support its mission and goals .

The Board of Trustees develops strategies to maintain sufficient income to fund the operating budget.

The Board of Trustees develops strategies, such as legacy gifts, to grow the Library's endowment.

Goal 4: The Library continues to evaluate the effectiveness and relevance of its programs.

The Library solicits suggestions from patrons and non-patrons, alike, to develop new materials, programs and resources.
